Phase 0 Stay at Home	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● School closed to public access ● No school facility rentals ● Extra intensive cleaning of the school building ● Pick-up food services provided for students 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All instruction and learning will be remote, including special education and other services ● No student or staff related travel ● No school sponsored extracurricular activities
Phase 1 15 people maximum per classroom or space	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● School closed to public access ● No school facility rentals ● Building cleaned and sanitized frequently ● Health screening and hand sanitizing upon entry of students, staff and visitors ● Handwashing and germ transmission prevention proactively taught and encouraged ● Wearing of masks or face shields recommended ● Public visitors to school limited ● Food service provided on-site or pickup ● School District health policies strictly enforced 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Instruction provided on-site and remotely for students on off days, or who need it for health reasons ● Each grade level split into groups of 15 people max ● Grades K-5 students on-site Mon through Thurs, split into groups, in different rooms with different instructors ● Grades 6-8 students attend two days per week, one group Mon & Wed, other group Tues & Thurs ● No instruction provided on Fridays ● Instruction limited to core subjects and classes ● Early dismissal every school day ● Staggered starts and dismissal times for small groups of students ● Modified schedule for recesses and lunch times ● Lunches eaten in classrooms ● Limited special education, special education related, and counseling services provided on-site ● Student and staff related travel permitted for 15 max ● No school sponsored extracurricular activities
Phase 2 50 people maximum per classroom or space	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Limited school access to public ● School facility rentals allowed for groups of 50 max ● Building cleaned and sanitized frequently ● Health screening and hand sanitizing upon entry of students, staff and visitors ● Handwashing and germ transmission prevention proactively taught and encouraged ● Wearing masks or face shields recommended ● Public visitors to school limited ● Food service provided on-site or pickup ● School District health policies strictly enforced 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Instruction provided on-site ● Remote learning available to those who need it for health reasons ● Each grade level class (K-8) grouped as normal ● Standard school week, subjects/classes, schedule, instructors, classrooms, etc. ● Modified schedule for lunch, recess, passing periods for groups of 50 max ● Student and staff related travel permitted in groups of 50 ● School sponsored extracurricular activities permitted in groups of 50 max
Phase 3 No limit on group size	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● School accessible to public ● School facility rentals allowed ● Building cleaned and sanitized frequently ● Health screening and hand sanitizing upon entry of students, staff and visitors when feasible ● Handwashing and germ transmission prevention proactively taught and encouraged ● Wearing masks or face shields recommended ● Public visitors to school allowed ● Food service provided on-site only ● School District health policies strictly enforced 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Instruction provided on-site ● Remote learning available to those who need it for health reasons ● Each grade level class (K-8) grouped as normal ● Standard school week, subjects/classes, schedule, instructors, classrooms ● Standard start and dismissal times for all students ● Standard lunch and recess times ● Student and staff related travel permitted ● School sponsored extracurricular activities permitted

These guidelines are based on guidance and recommendations from the Governor, Flathead City-County Health Department, Montana Office of Public Instruction, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, American Academy of Pediatrics, and additional resources, including review of numerous examples from other school districts in the state and country. **Changes and updates will be made based on updated guidance and recommendations from those groups listed above.**
